The current lease can then be added to the Land Registry title. The solicitor is seeking approval from the Rank Trust for the variation in the use of the pavilion. He has advised that it would be possible to include the details of the new tenant in the sub-lease and therefore not have to write a Deed of Variation. However, it is understood that this would only cover the current proposed tenant and, on this basis, it was agreed that a Deed of Variation should be written to allow for potential new tenants in the future. The plumbing changes at the pavilion, necessary for the dog grooming salon, were formally agreed subject to the sub-lease noting that any changes must be made good at the end of the tenancy.  Security of the Gratton The new gate, bollards and shroud covers are to be installed in the next few weeks. The Chair of the Gratton Trust has written to the Gratton Surgery noting that the gate in their car park remains a security risk in respect of unlawful access to the Gratton.  Elm trees It was agreed that three new disease resistant elm trees can be planted on the Gratton.
