		<u>Bob Brewer</u> – Bob noted that there are tree roots growing through the pavement near the Wessex Park entrance.	
		The Clerk will report this to HCC.	
	2.2	Report from HCCIIr Jackie Porter: HCCIIr Porter provided a written report (Appendix 1)	
		which notes her objection to the HCC proposal for Local Government Reorganisation i	
		Hampshire and draws attention to the planning proposal for 3 million square feet of	
		commercial space between the A303 and the A33 (a Basingstoke and Deane application).	
		In addition, HCCllr Porter noted that the golf club at Three Maids Hill want to add paddle	
		courts. This is a noisy sport and issues arise at Winchester Tennis Club and Whitely but	
		less likely here as the courts would be sited near the golf course. It would however lead to	
		more traffic on what is already a very busy roundabout.	
		HCCllr Porter has spoken with Steven Mills of the Flood Action Group about the storage	
		of the flood equipment and will now put him in direct contact with the Gratton Trust who	
		have offered to store the equipment in the pavilion.	
	2.3	Report from WCCIIr Stephen Godfrey: WCCIIr Godfrey noted that a lot of time is being spent on Local Government Reorganisation. The submissions have now been made to	
		Government. The WCC preference is for WCC, Test Valley and East Hants to form a	
		unitary but other councils had different preferences. A draft decision is likely in November	
		followed by a further consultation and with elections for the new unitary authorities in May	
		2027. The districts will be dissolved a year after this when the unitaries will take over.	
		A new Town Council is to be formed in Winchester and some existing parishes may be	
		merged in to this.	
		Micheldever Station has not been identified as one of the 12 new town sites selected by	
		Government.	
		In their Local Plan Basingstoke and Deane are proposing 4200 homes on Popham	
		Airfield and industrial units to the south of Blackwood. A consultation will follow. These developments would require a large amount of new infrastructure in the WCC area but	
		WCC do not support this.	
		The new mayor will have responsibility for strategic planning which may give a better	
		overall view but this will not take effect until 2028.	
	2.4	Report from WCCIIr Caroline Horrill: WCCIIr Horrill advised that a response has been	
		received from the Inspector reviewing the Winchester Local Plan and modifications are	
		being made to reflect her comments.	
		A call for sites will be made shortly for the next local plan.	
		Southern Water have a further update for residents but this does not appear to have been received as yet. WCCllr Horrill will supply a copy to the Clerk for circulation to the	
		councillors.
